The primary purpose of the analytical review is to detect possible reporting or accounting related errors, and also to identify significant fluctuations from prior years data that are not sufficiently explained in the annual report. The analytical review identified the following issues:

1. The 8" service lateral contributed at the expense of a manufacturing company as detailed in the footnotes to page W-16 should be recorded on the utility's books (at actual or estimated cost) by debiting Account 345, Services, and crediting Account 271, Contributions in Aid of Construction. Please confirm that these adjustments will be reflected in the utility's 2002 annual report.
2. Please provide a more detailed description of the \$100 reported in Account 418, Nonoperating Rental Income on page F-2 and follow this procedure in the future.

In addition, you may receive additional inquiries from our office regarding your annual report during a rate case, construction authorization, or other Commission reviews.
