- 135 applications were submitted requesting over 42 million dollars with the Commission expecting to award up to \$10 million dollars to eligible projects.
- A review of the applications is underway, with the Commission expected to announce grant recipients in the spring of 2023.

U.S. Department of Energy Announces \$35 Million to Deploy Clean Energy on Tribal Lands

- The DOE Office of Indian Energy is soliciting applications from Indian Tribes, Intertribal Organizations, and Tribal Energy Development Organizations to provide electric power to Tribal Buildings, which otherwise would be unelectrified, by deploying integrated energy system or energy infrastructure.
- Applications are due February 23, 2023.

Indian Energy Funding Opportunities

Home Efficiency & Electrification Rebate Programs RFI

- The U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) Office of State and Community Energy Programs has released a Request for Information (RFI) for the Home Energy Rebate programs.
- The RFI includes the HOMES rebate program and the High-Efficiency Electric Home rebate program (HEERHA) and intends to inform the DOE guidance.
- Wisconsin has been allocated approximately \$74.9M for HOMES and \$74.5M for HEERHA.
- OEI and Focus on Energy representatives are preparing a response; all other interested parties who would like to respond can do so until March 3, 2023.
