

Record Number of Broadband Grants Received

The Public Service Commission received 241 applications totaling more than \$438 million for the first round of broadband funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The funding for the grants was made available by Governor Tony Evers and applications were due on July 27th.

Internet service providers, telecommunications utilities, cooperatives, local governments, and for-profit and non-profit organizations were eligible to apply for grants. The Commission will review and approve projects this fall for projects that will be completed by December 31, 2024. In addition to following federal guidance from the U.S. Treasury Department, the PSC will evaluate broadband projects based on applicant capacity, capability, performance, planning, project budget, proposed matching funds, and the proposed service area's existing broadband service needs. Funds will be disbursed through a reimbursement process similar to the current process for the state Broadband Expansion Grant Program. All the applications are publicly available on the Commission's electronic record system (erf) under the docket 5-BF-2022.

Broadband Office staff wanted to give kudos to the all the ARPA grant applicants that submitted geo-spatial files of their proposed projects. Data submissions from applicants increase accuracy and save time.

Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM) is seeking to partner with internet service providers and telecommunication carriers to improve the State's response to a variety of emergencies. The goals would be for the State's Emergency Operations Center to have better situational awareness regarding internet and telecommunication access and outages. Such a partnership would also give providers a pathway to tap into state and private sector resources during disasters to restore service.

Broadband Coverage Data Collection Starts Sept. 1

Starting September 1st, the Wisconsin Broadband Office will again be accepting voluntary submittals of broadband coverage data from Internet Service Providers (ISPs) in the state. Coverage data will be used to provide more accurate and timely updates to the Wisconsin Broadband Map; to create a better representation of internet service across Wisconsin; and lead to more accurate analyses of broadband deployment. We urge all providers in the State to submit coverage data.

A survey will be sent by email to all known internet service providers in the state collecting contact information, information about the type of data and additional information about programs for low income costumers.

The voluntary broadband coverage data collection will be open for 90 days for this round. The data collection period will end December 1, 2021. Questions about coverage data collection can be emailed to: PSCBroadbandData@wisconsin.gov.

Grant Recipient Corner: ERF or Email?

"ERF" is the term used by PSC Staff that stands for the PSC's Electronic Records Filing System, and we use it as a noun and a verb. Among other things, this system allows members of the public to submit and obtain information. In the realm of broadband grants, it is the system that grantees should use to file their project status reports – think of it as keeping the public up-to-date about your project. Always file your project status reports, whether interim or final, on ERF.

The quickest way to get to ERF from the <u>PSC's Homepage</u> is to scroll to the bottom and click on the "ERF Upload" button. Once you get to the ERF homepage, note that there is also a Help button in the lower right corner if you need it.
