

Transition to Affordable Connectivity Program

Congress created the <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u> building on the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program created in 2021. The programs' goal is to help low-income households pay for internet service and connected devices. The Affordable Connectivity Program will retain the basic structure of the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program, with some changes to eligibility, rules and the benefit level. The discount will decrease from \$50/month in the current Emergency Broadband Benefit Program to \$30/month in the longer-term Affordable Connectivity Program.

For the over 160,000 households in Wisconsin enrolled in Emergency Broadband Benefit Program, Congress has created a 60-day transition period beginning on December 31, 2021. During the transition, anyone who was eligible for and signed up for the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program remains eligible and will continue to receive a subsidy of up to \$50/month until March 1, 2022. After March 1, many households will remain eligible and the benefit will continue. Some households may need to requalify and other households may need to opt-in to service. State Broadband Expansion Grant Information

The <u>State Broadband Expansion Grant Program</u> aims to deploy high performance broadband in underserved areas of the State. On December 1, 2021 the Commission announced that it is now accepting applications for FY2022 Broadband Expansion Grants. This round will make available up to \$100 million for grants. Eligible applicants will demonstrate a clear and achievable plan to improve broadband communications services in one or more underserved areas in the State. The Wisconsin Broadband Office recently posted <u>updated information</u> regarding changes to the grant agreement in FY2022 related to the source of funds.

Telemedicine Grant

The Medical Telecommunications Equipment Program is a grant program under the Universal Service Fund that enables non-profit medical clinics or public health agencies to apply for funding to purchase medical telecommunications equipment.

The Commission will make up to \$1,000,000 available to purchase medical telecommunications equipment that will promote technologically advanced medical services, enhance access to medical care in rural or underserved areas of the state or to underserved populations or to persons with disabilities.

Nonprofit Access Grant Program

The program enables nonprofit groups to apply for partial funding of programs or projects that will facilitate affordable access to telecommunications and digital inclusion activities. The project must assist low-income households, people with disabilities or customers in areas of the state that have relatively high costs of services in obtaining affordable access to a basic set of essential telecommunications services. The Commission may award up to \$500,000 in grants under this program on a fiscal year basis.

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Broadband Grant Programs Listening Sessions

NTIA will host broadband grant program public virtual listening sessions in connection with the five new broadband grant programs authorized and funded by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act: The Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program; the Enabling Middle Mile Broadband Infrastructure Program; and the Digital Equity Act Programs, which include the State Digital Equity Planning Grant Program, State Digital Equity Capacity Grant Program, and Digital Equity Competitive Grant Program. These public virtual listening sessions are designed to collect stakeholder input to help inform program development and implementation.

USDA ReConnect Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Rural Utilities Service (RUS) announced more than \$1 billion in funding to promote broadband access in rural, Tribal and socially vulnerable communities through the <u>ReConnect program</u>. The program will offer eligible recipients a mix of grants, grants and loans combined and just loans to support the construction, improvement, or acquisition of facilities and equipment to deploy robust, high performance broadband capable of 100/100 Mbps.

FCC Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) Funding Authorizations

Applications are open now and due February 22, 2022.

The FCC continues to review long-form applications of winning bidders in the RDOF Auction 904 on a 'rolling basis.' As of January 14, 2022 the following winners have been authorized for funding, Baldwin Telecom, Inc., Bruce Telephone Company, Inc.; Cuba City Telephone Exchange Co.; La Valle Telephone Cooperative, Inc. Richland-Grant Telephone Cooperative, Inc. and Somerset Telephone Co., Inc.. The following winners are ready to authorize: Lakeland Communications Group, LLC, Marquette-Adams Telephone Cooperative, Inc., and Reedsburg Utility Commission.


