


# 194 Applications Requesting More Than \$495 Million for Broadband Expansion Received

The Commission received 194 applications requesting more than \$495 million for the state's Broadband Expansion Grant Program. Funding for the grants was provided by the 2021 - 23 biennial budget, signed by Gov. Evers in July 2021. Since Gov. Evers has been in office, the state has awarded \$164 million to 262 projects to expand broadband statewide. As a result, more than 300,000 homes and businesses will be connected to high-speed internet following the completion of all previously funded projects.

The PSC's State Broadband Office made the first round of grant applications available on Dec. 1, 2021, due on March 17, 2022. PSC will evaluate each grant based on the matching funds, public-private partnerships, economic development, scalability, impact, and the proposed service area's existing broadband service needs. The Commission is accepting written comments in opposition to grant applications until 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 14, 2022. Grant applicants who wish to respond to opposition comments must do so by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday April 21, 2022. Notice of Objection period.

#### FCC New Broadband Data Collection to begin by June 30, 2022

The Federal Communication Commission announced the inaugural broadband data collection filing timeline. All facilities-based providers of fixed and mobile broadband internet service can begin submitting broadband availability data under the new standards starting June 30, 20022 and must submit the data by September 1, 2022. #### FCC Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) Funding Authorizations

The FCC continues to review long-form applications of winning bidders in the RDOF Auction 904 on a rolling basis. As of March 25, 2022 the following winners have been authorized for funding in Wisconsin: Baldwin Telecom, Inc., Bruce Telephone Company, Inc., Charter Fiberlink CCO, LLC, Cuba City Telephone Exchange Co., La Valle Telephone Cooperative, Inc., Lakeland Communications Group, LLC, Richland-Grant Telephone Cooperative, Inc., and Somerset Telephone Co. Inc.

The following winners are *ready to authorize* in Wisconsin: CenturyTel of the Midwest - Wisconsin, LLC, Marquette-Adams Telephone Cooperative, Inc. and Reedsburg Utility Commission.

#### **Emergency Connectivity Fund 3rd Filing Window Announced**


The FCC <u>announced</u> a third application filing window for the <u>Emergency Connectivity</u> <u>Fund (ECF)</u> program with a minimum of \$1 billion dollars available across the nation for eligible schools and libraries. The 3rd filing window will open Thursday April 28, 2022 and close on Friday May 13, 2022. In Wisconsin \$70,774,613 has been approved in the first two rounds.

#### **Bipartisan Infrastructure Law**

The White House has released a "Guidebook to the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law for State, Local, Tribal, and Territorial Governments, and Other Partners." The guidebook provides a nice overview of each broadband related program in the law including brief descriptions and eligible uses for each program. The broadband section begins on page 385.

Created by 2015 Wisconsin Act 278, Broadband Forward! is a voluntary program for local units of government (city, village, town, or county) to signal that the political subdivision has taken steps to reduce obstacles to broadband infrastructure investment. #### **Notice of Inquiry on Elimination of Digital Discrimination Open for Comments**

The FCC recently <u>announced</u> it is seeking comments in their proceeding on the prevention and elimination of digital discrimination. As part of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, Congress found that access to affordable, reliable, high-speed broadband is essential to full participation in modern life and that subscribes should benefit from equal access to broadband service. The FCC is tasked with adopting rules to prevent digital discrimination based on income level, race, ethnicity, color, religion, or national origin. Initial comments are due on May 16th. <u>Notice of Inquiry on Preventing Digital Discrimination</u>.

#### **NEW Digital Inclusion Coalition Guidebook**

The National Digital Inclusion Alliance (NDIA) recently published a guidebook for digital inclusion coalitions. The guidebook is intended for individuals and organizations committed to advancing digital equity in their community. The free guidebook provides an overview of coalition models, best practices, lessons learned and specific recommendations from the field of digital equity.

#### Public Service Commission of Wisconsin Requesting Comments on Middle Mile

The Commission is committed to expanding broadband service in unserved and underserved areas of the state. To assist in the deployment of expanded service, the Commission directed staff to investigate how to best support and coordinate the construction of middle mile fiber routes, and prepare informational recommendations for the Commission. The Commission requests comments from interested parties on the topic of construction of middle mile broadband infrastructure. The Commission is interested in how to evaluate middle mile proposals in grant programs and also how to structure the grant awards to best reinforce existing routes or build out new middle mile routes to reach areas that currently have inadequate broadband service.

### **Grant Recipient Corner**

#### State Expansion Grants

State Project Status Reports are due April 30, 2022, for all currently open State grant rounds. You should use the most current report form, which can always be found on our <u>Broadband Grants</u> webpage.

If your project is not completed, file an interim project status report.

If your project is completed (all project milestones met), then file a <u>final Project Status Report</u> along with your final reimbursement request **and** a depiction of the project coverage area in spatial format at the address level.

Always file your project status reports on <u>ERF</u>, the Commission's Electronic Records Filing system, and be sure to give it descriptive words that help identify the grant to which it pertains.

## Federal ARPA Grants

For grant recipients with awards from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Broadband Access Grants the federal grant team will be posting a webinar on the Broadband grant reimbursement process.

The pre-recorded webinar will be available on the <u>PSC Broadband grant</u> webpage in the federal grant section the first week of April.

All grant recipients should watch the webinar before submitting reimbursement.
