

PSC operates allocation process: reviewing, scoring, and selecting recipients
 NTIA oversees to ensure compliance, approves proposals & final allocation
 Participants are entities that will construct, own, and operate broadband infrastructure

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








Cost Model For Universal Service – fiber



Conclusions



- Identified 4 likely damages
- Represents <1% of telecom's 436 damages to gas
- Supports hypothesis of little overlap between grant areas and gas
 - infrastructure






