The Public Service Commission staff is in the process of completing an analytical review of your utility's 2000 annual report. The purposes of an analytical review are to detect possible reporting or accounting related errors and to identify significant fluctuations from established trends in reported data not sufficiently explained in the annual report. It is our hope that this review will supply information that will enable us to better provide guidance to your utility regarding proper utility accounting and the preparation of future annual reports. In order to complete this review, we request the following information:

1. During our review, we noted that the Total kWh used for pumping for the year reported on the Source of Supply, Pumping and Purchased Water Statistics schedule is 3,714. However, \$6,035 is reported in the Operation and Maintenance Expense schedule for power for pumping expense. At an average cost of \$.06 per kWh, 3,714 appears low. This issue was also addressed in our reviews of the utility's 1998 and 1999 annual reports. Please explain.

2. We appreciate the response from Donald Matts, Maintenance Supervisor, to our letter of January 4, 2001, regarding minimizing water losses. It is too early to conclude if your reported water loss shows a downward trend. The pump control problem from a lightning strike could explain some of the loss. It was reported that your utility would be repairing the control system, checking more meters for accuracy, continue the on-going checks for leaks, working with your Auditor to develop a more accurate water usage program. If losses do not reduce to lower levels, you may need to enlist additional technical assistance.

We appreciate your cooperation in providing the above information. These recommendations are intended to provide accounting assistance and should not be construed as criticisms of utility personnel. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at (608) 267-9198. Please respond within 30 days of this letter. We prefer that you respond by e-mail if it is convenient for you to do so.
