4. Whenever schedules call for data from the previous year, the data reported must be based upon those shown by the annual report of the previous year or an appropriate explanation given why different data is being reported for the current year. Where available, use an adjustment column.
5. All dollar amounts will be reported in whole dollars.
6. Wherever information is required to be shown as text, the information shall be shown in the space provided using other than account titles. In each case, the information shall be properly identified. Footnote capability is included in the annual report software program and shall be utilized where necessary to further explain particulars of a schedule.
